









Executive Summary

The Prince Edward Island Energy Corporation is a provincial Crown corporation whose form and function is dictated by the (PEI) *Energy Corporation Act*. Through ownership of wind farms at North Cape (10.56 MW) and East Point (30 MW), the Corporation supplies approximately 121,500,000 kilowatt-hours of renewable electricity to Islanders. The Corporation provides an advisory service to government on energy matters that result in the formulation of policy, programs and legislation. Within its mandate, the Corporation also provides financing and support to other energy projects in PEI.









"I have become slightly obsessed by your energy graph and am very grateful that you have found a way to record the load and wind power generated in PEI. <u>Do you by any</u> chance have a spread sheet of these values? I am looking at using storage to balance wind fluctuations and was hoping to try and using the real load and wind data to accomplish that."
