GREETING :

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by Section 14
(1) of Chapter 30 of the Acts passed
by the Assembly of Prince Edward
Island in the Session thereof held in
the year 1950 and in the fourteenth
year of Our Reign, intituled An Act
to Enable the Inhabitants of Certain
Villages to Supply Themselves with
Certain Services, it is enacted as
follows :—

"If a majority of the votes polled
are in favor of this Act applying to
such village, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council may by proclamation
in the Royal Gazette :

(a) declare that on and after
a date to be named in such pro-
clamation this Act shall apply to such
village;

(b) define the boundaries of
such village to which this Act is to
apply;

(c) appoint three commissioners
for such village for the carrying out
of the purposes of this Act".

AND IT APPEARING that a poll
has been duly conducted in the ~~Vil-
lage of Crapaud~~ pursuant to the said
Act, and that a majority of the votes
polled thereat are in favor of the
said Act applying to such village;

NOW KNOW YE that we, by and
with the advice of Our Executive
Council for Prince Edward Island,
do by this Our Proclamation order
and declare,—

(a) that the said Act shall
apply to the Village of Crapaud on
and after the first day of August, A.
D. 1950;

(b) the boundaries of the said
Village of Crapaud to be within and
extend to a radius of one-quarter
mile from Crapaud Corner;

(c) the appointment of John
Nicholson, Crapaud; Brent Wood,
Crapaud and George Wotton, Cra-
paud as three Commissioners for
such Village for the carrying out of
the purposes of the said Act.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF we
have caused these Our Letters to be
made Patent and the Great Seal of
Prince Edward Island to be hereunto
affixed.

**"THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT"
REGULATIONS**

Made under the provisions of
Section 106 of "The Highway Traf-
fic Act" by His Honour the Lieu-
tenant-Governor-in-Council, on the
20th day of July, A.D. 1950.

SAFETY REGULATIONS

1. In the case of persons being
transported in trucks in space nor-
mally intended for merchandise, such
persons shall conclusively be deemed
to ride in a manner that is unsafe
or dangerous, within the meaning of
Section 58 (b).—

(a) where more than ten per-
sons are so transported in one truck
at one time;

(b) where such truck is driven
at a speed greater than twenty miles
per hour;

(c) unless every such truck has
secure seating accommodation and
all such persons are seated while
being so transported.

2. (1) The preceding regulation
shall not apply to any public vehicle
operated under a franchise or license
from the Public Utilities Commission.

(2) Subsections (a) and (c) of
the preceding regulation shall not
apply to,—

(a) any vehicle mentioned
in paragraphs (4) and (5) of sub-
section (c) of Section 2 of The Public
Vehicle Act; or

(b) any vehicle engaged
in carrying passengers to or from
church or any other place of worship.
