
The Strongspace w@bsite makes it easy to sign up for an account, easy to pay for an account, and easy to use an account. And when things go wrong, they've got a real person -- his name is Justin -- to answer questions. Quickly and completely.

[[David Cairns]] taught me an important lesson more than a decade ago: it's not <i>if</i> your hard drive is going to fail, it's <i>when</i>. Hard drives are tiny machines that are moving all the time; they <i>have</i> to fail eventually. Now think of all the email, photos, music, and whatever else you have on your computer that you've neglected to back up. Now imagine it gone. Forever. Now go and sign up for a Strongspace account and back your stuff up: for \$8/month, it's worth it, and you'll be supporting a good group of people doing a good thing well.

Strongspace is one of an interesting new breed of web offerings that do simple, important things well. Let's call them "microservice companies." Unlike Yahoo!, which wants to sell you love, sell you greeting cards and heal your dog, these new microservice companies leverage Trackback

The New New Things

The oven timer just dinged and some of the things we've been cooking up in Flickr HQ are ready for serving. If you want to dive right in, check out the new <u>explore page</u> and skip the rest of this post ;)

 First up is clustering, a better way to explore photos through tags. You can still see the most recent photos with a given tag (say, <u>summer</u>) but now you can also root around the finer distinctions: <u>summer beach vacations</u> versus <u>summer flowers and nature</u> - and all the clusters are <u>collected on one page</u>. It's neat!

Here are some good tags to try: <u>lion</u>, <u>cute</u>, <u>graduation</u>, <u>europe</u> or even one of the classic search disambiguation problems like <u>jaguar</u> or <u>turkey</u> - nicely broken up into <u>the country</u>, <u>the food</u> and <u>the thanksgiving favorite</u>.

 The other new feature is called <u>interestingness</u> and it's huge! A long time in the making, interestingness is a ranking algorithm based on user behavior around the photos taking into account some obvious things like how many users add the photo to their favorites and some subtle things like the relationship between the person who uploaded the photo and the people who are commenting (plus a whole bunch of secret sauce).



It's huge because we have hundreds of thousands of photos uploaded every day - now we have a way to find the good ones: here are <u>some of the best from December 11th, 2004</u> or check out this monthly calendar view of March 2005. There's

It promises to be an interesting night.



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








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
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So Who Was this "Molly Stark" Woman?

THERE SEEM TO be certain New England legends that evolve out of no logical sequence of events at all. Merely a little something someone *said* can catch our imagination, be repeated and perhaps somewhat embellished, and eventually ... voila! It takes its place among the New England legends we love.

There are dozens of examples I could cite, but perhaps the most puzzling is the legend of Molly Stark. Puzzling because Molly never said anything or did anything of note. However, her husband, New Hampshire General John Stark, said and did a lot of things. It was John who made Molly a legend at the Revolutionary War battle of Bennington, Vermont. "There are the Redcoats," was his battle cry just prior to the battle that morning, "and they are ours, or this night Molly Stark sleeps a widow."

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




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
